How to Cite Archival Materials

Proper acknowledgment shall be given for all materials used. The citation should appear as follows:

For Manuscript Collections:

[Identification of the item, title of the collection,] Stuart A. Rose Manuscript, Archives, and Rare Book Library, Emory University.

For Emory University Archives Materials:

[Identification of the item, title of the series,] Emory University Archives, Stuart A. Rose Manuscript, Archives, and Rare Book Library, Emory University.

For example, if you are citing (whether directly quoting, paraphrasing, or building upon an idea or text), you should include an in-text citation appropriate to the style guide you are using and a full citation in your bibliography.

Here are some examples:
